Goals and Objectives	<p>The main purpose of studying this subject for students of Political Science is to provide them with the key concepts of the rule of law and constitutional democracy. Students will gain theoretical knowledge of constitutional law through the analysis of concepts and constitutional systems, the examination of politics from a constitutional perspective, institutional analysis, as well as the study of Human Rights and Liberties protected by the constitution. Students will learn about the constitutional system of the Republic of Kosovo in particular, but also about the constitutional systems of advanced democracies. Understanding the importance of the constitution in the political system, familiarization with mechanisms limiting political power, as well as the control and balance of powers, will be top priorities. Additionally, the study of the process of drafting and amending the constitution, as well as constitutional justice, will be analysed as theoretical knowledge and primary objective case studies for students' participation in these processes, and for interpretations and analyses of constitutional political developments.</p>
