Goals and objectives	Starting from the fact that the economy is one of the main pillars influencing the development and integrative processes of a country, on which many other issues depend from a social, political, and security perspective, it is anticipated that through this course the student will become acquainted with the main economic categories. Above all, the main focus will be on criminal activities that attack the economic system of a country and beyond, and the measures that need to be taken to protect against criminal actions directed against the functioning of the economic system.
	In this context, various phenomena of this nature will be analyzed, such as money laundering, tax evasion, white-collar crime, especially insurance and buyer fraud, counterfeiting money, protection of industrial property and copyright, false bankruptcy, etc. Based on the highlighted points above, this course will also provide fundamental knowledge on the criminal methodology used for the detection and proof of these criminal acts, which in most legislations fall into the category of economic and financial crime, relying on the legal regulations of the Republic of Kosovo and beyond.
