Course goals and objectives	In this course, students will learn about the policy making process in Kosovo. Throughout the course, they will learn to apply public policy concepts discussed in the Public Policy Analysis course to the Kosovo context. Students will also learn to make comparisons between the policy making process in Kosovo and those in other countries.
